Treasurer: has care and custody of all money belonging to the Club; shall give an account of finances at the meetings;


Secretary: keep minutes and records of the Club; attend to all correspondence and present any communications to the Club

How about a Corvette camping conversion?

1966 Corvette Restoration # 4

This month, Nick and I decided to take all the components off the motor so we could rebuild and detail all items. The headers, alternator, fuel pump, distributor, and intake manifold were removed so a better detailing could be done on the motor. Looking into the motor we saw how clean it was and that it was ported for extra free HP. A newer more powerfully manifold was put in place with a Holley carburetor to extract even more HP out of the motor.

The gauge cluster was next removed to be taken apart, cleaned and tested . We found that the main wire harness was shorted out and burnt, but our car came with a new one for replacement. Nick found the short that caused the damage before we put the new harness in place. If we didn't find the cause it would cost another \$500 for another new harness, and a possible a fire under the dash. The steering column was removed to be taken apart, replace the front bearing, cleaned, checked, and painted.


The whole dash center with pads was removed so we could remove the wiper motor to be cleaned and checked and make sure it still worked. There is a picture that shows what the car looks like with dash console and everything removed to the fire wall.

Nick didn't like the fact that the dash pads were faded, so they were removed to be redyed to look new again. (See the picture that shows the pads and old wire harness}. The center console is ready to put in place so we put the wiper motor and heater assembly in place first. The dash center was glued in place and the new wire harness was reinstalled. The fun part comes in play at this time when we put the gauge cluster in place and making sure that all the wires and light bulbs go into the right place. There isn't much space behind the dash to work on this if you have big hands and little patience. After working on your back in the dark for 2 hours everything should be in place (we hoped). The last thing was to put the steering column in place and connect it to the harness. We then checked every thing with low voltage to make sure there weren't any more shorts.

We logged another 100 hours of love and more \$\$\$ this month. If you have any questions about this project, give me a call

Captain Ted made his initial "tack" toward shore, Pirate Pete exclaimed that he recognized a shore establishment and indeed its proprietor. After closing with the shore we all recognized our fellow WNYCC member Joe who welcomed us to his home and allowed us to dock our boat. After visiting with Joe and touring his home, we set off once again on a shore excursion to find some "grub", as Pirate Pete was starting to get hungry. The trek was uphill and we found the first two establishments closed (they probably saw us coming). After exploring a bit further we managed to find another establishment which provided our seafarers with a hearty meal and

the opportunity to discuss restaurant design. Subsequently, we returned to Joe's dock and met up to once again sail the mighty lake. As we were sailing away some of the locals exclaimed, "How did those foreigners gain access to the lake"—they may never find out.

Now it was time for a change of drivers and Captain Ted relinquished the helm to Pirate Pete (who didn't really want to drive at all). We slowly sailed the shallow waters of the lake observing the many lake front cottages, year around homes, and camps, until all of a sudden a vibration arose from the rear of the boat yes fans we had gone aground (but just a little). Captain Ted resumed his position at the helm and eased us cautiously from the shallows. (No harm, no foul)

Upon returning to our point of embarkation, we prepared the boat for winter storage, so that next summer we will once again be ready to strike fear along the waterways of Western New York.



C6 Ignition Switch Repair

The C6 Corvette which includes model years 2005-2013 changed from the key-operated ignition switch to a dash mounted push button. To get into the car and start it, your key fob is important. Besides theft prevention, the key fob allows your doors to open and your engine to start. The top part of the ignition/start on the dash with the bullseye starts the car, the bottom right is the accessories position, and the bottom left is the off position to shut down the car. C7 Corvettes are a little different with push to start, then push again to shut down the car. Automatic transmission cars should be in the park position with the parking brake engaged. Standard 6-Speed transmissions should be in reverse, clutch in, with the parking brake on to shut off the car.

Your Čorvette still uses battery power when it is off to keep the radio clock going plus other requirements of the onboard computers for the car alarm, door latch recognition, and car start capability. I read somewhere that if your Corvette is not used in 28 days your battery could run down enough not to start the car. That time is greatly reduced if you shut off the car in the Accessories position. For winter storage I recommend each C6 and C7 owner have a Corvette sponsored trickle charger that plugs in to the Cigarette lighter/DC power port in the interior. This

is safe for your battery and car electronics and keeps your battery up to fully charged. They are available online for about \$120. What happens when the ignition/start switch goes bad? Contacts can wear, short out, or get dirty. In my 2005 Corvette, the battery mysteriously wore down and I was unable to get into my vehicle with the key fob or start the car. I had to use the regular key to open the trunk, pull the manual cable on the left to open the driver's door, then pull the manual latch for the engine compartment. I disconnected the battery, gave it a full charge and then re-connected the 12 volt battery cable. The dash on my car was flashing and I could not start the car. Thoughts ran through my head of expensive onboard computers being burned out and an expensive tow and visit to the dealer. I went online to some of the Corvette forums where other Corvette owners help each other. The problem I found was in the Ignition/ Start switch.

Ordering the OEM GM replacement switch online was easy and it was \$40.

Also, I went online for instructions to replace the switch. Disconnect the battery, position the steering wheel up and out for more room. The plastic dash bezel where the switch is located can be pried open in two points on each side of the steering wheel. You can carefully use a flat screwdriver or a small plastic pry bar. The wiring harness to the switch has a locking plastic tab that must be retracted at the same time you pull the wiring harness off. Be careful not to break any mounting tabs on the switch for the harness and the mounting of the switch on the bezel (dash panel) Wiring can be plugged back into a new switch and the switch snapped back into place in the dash. The dash bezel also can be snapped back

into place. The repair was easy but you had to take care not to break any plastic parts. You can then reconnect the battery. My car works fine, starts fine and shuts off fine. I did however, replace all door button switches, the two inside the car in the armrest/door handle, and the two outside door unlock buttons on the inside lip of the doors. I had one outside switch on the passenger side giving us trouble with opening. The inside switches were\$20 a piece and the outside were \$35 per pair. All were OEM GM switches and the outside ones were advertised as being "New and Improved ". So Chevrolet Corvette did have some issues with performance in design in the original ones.

Geanine and Areta for another great trip!

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




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
