Restoration of a 1964 Corvette

Last year I helped my friend Steve work on his 1964 Corvette convertible that was taken off the road because of a front end accident about 35 years ago. I wrote articles with pictures about what we worked on, because I thought our members would be interested on the progress we were making. I talked about the how we put the new front clip on the Vette and how it was done. I also had to change the dash, and front wire harness to get everything to work. Steve decided to put the car into storage at that time because his business was picking up and he didn't have time to start the paint job.

Last month Steve started to work on the body and finished the fiber glassing of the body. He primed the body and spent many hours block sanding the body that eliminated any imperfections before it was painted. Steve painted a beautiful color of Mediterranean Blue that really makes this car stand out. The next step was many hours of water sanding and buffing the new paint until it shines.

It's now time to put all the trim and chrome on the new paint and not scratch, chip or crack the newly painted surface. I started with the turning headlights, by putting the motors and bulbs in, and connecting the wire harness to make everything work. They now light up and turn with the switch in the car. The tail and front turn signals were next to be installed and checked to make sure they worked properly. The front grill was next installed along with some of the front bumper brackets that went through it. We are now ready to put the 3 piece front bumpers together with the lower brackets on the car. The trick is not to damage the body, so it took 3 people to carefully install the assembly. We next adjusted and tighten bolts until it look good. (check the pictures)

The progress had to stop on the body because we were waiting for a new front window to be installed and then the trim pieces could be put in place. I now had time to correct the Hurst shifter where the levers were put on backwards many years ago. The problem was inside of the car with the shifter in first gear the trany was in second gear and when the shifter was in third, the trany was in forth gear. To fix this I had to take the shifter levers off, turn them around and re-adjust all the shifter levers (works great now).

Running out time and we will work on the interior in the next article.






