Restoration of a 1964 Corvette

Last month I talked about installing the new radio, speaker, clock, and glove box in the dashboard. With that accomplished it is time to install the rugs that are fit formed to help fit in the right position in the floor pan. A trick I used was to put the rug in and lift half of it up and spray the glue on both surfaces and set it down in its location. Then I would do the same to the other half. I started with the passenger side, next driver and then rear carpets were installed. Working in an enclosed space with the strong glue fumes made me high, but the rugs came out good.

The heater duct was next put in place so I could install the center console in place along with the dash side covers. The hard part is to get all the screw holes to match the fasteners so all parts fit together, and look good.

Steve decided to change the color of the door panels, arm rest and seat to white leather that looked great and broke the interior up with black dash and rugs. It took a whole day to put the seats in place, so the car could be driven to the trim shop to install the new white top on the convertible frame. We put the convertible top frame on the car and adjusted it to the door windows so that both hard top and retractable top had the proper fit.

The last thing was to install the factory knock off wheels the correct way, so they wouldn't come off when driven. There are 2 LH, and 2 RH adapters that must go on the proper side of the car, plus a list of instructions how to torque the wheels on so they don't come off when the car is driven. Factory Knock offs look great on Corvettes, but if they unscrew when driving, they will do a lot of damage.

At this time the project will stop to have the new convertible top put on at the trim shop. The next article will be the last on this car because it will be finished, and the 1966 comes out of storage to be worked on again.

As I started to pull this event together, I paid more attention to the surroundings and found the Buffalo Distilling Company was a few buildings over. As the event grew closer, I wasn't sure what to expect; I am not a beer drinker yet the businesses intrigued me being in the new "Larkinville" area. Well, I have to say they did not disappoint!!!

The tour of the processing facility at Flying Bison was to be 30 minutes and we went way over that with all our questions and a great tour guide in Tim. They literally have a few million dollars of equipment in that back room. We then hurried across the lot to the Buffalo Distilling Company to make our tour time. Roy, an English professor at Buffalo State Collage, gave us the background on the building and the business. The intent was to call their offerings Buffalo Vodka, Buffalo Brandy, etc but another distillery in Buffalo, Kentucky, threatened a lawsuit. In search of a new name, the owners recalled an old broken rooster weather vane that was missing one foot on a farm in Bennington; the guys had jokingly named it the "One Foot Cock". And the name of their product was then born—they make One Foot Cock Vodka, One Foot Cock Brandy, and One Foot Cock Bourbon. They even make One Foot Cock Krupnik, a Polish honey brandy! We got to taste a few products and a some of us even went to the bar up front to try more samples. Others went back to Flying Bison to try the Flight of Beer, four 4oz glasses to taste the different kinds. We joked that our photographer Bob Metz should have taken a photo of the board on the wall as everyone was referring to their favorite beers by number not the name!!! We were having such a great time I had to move the reservation at Chef's back by half an hour.

There were 19 of us at Chef's and as luck would have it, it was Restaurant Week and most ordered the \$20.18 specials. Of course the food was delicious. And with beautiful sunny warm weather, it was the perfect day!!




