Treasurer: has care and custody of all money belonging to the Club; shall give an account of finances at the meetings.

Secretary: keep minutes and records of the Club; attend to all correspondence and present any communications to the Club Board of Director(s):

The business of this organization shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of two members at large, the officers, and the past President. The Past President shall serve one year only. After one year, the Past President will no longer serve on the Board. This position will then be opened to any full member to run for the Board.


