

We are writing this on the first day of WINTER, along with the brisk cold weather it is the longest day of the year. Happy 2025. At least each day we will be gaining a thin slice of daylight.

Since our "Pride and Joy(s)" are all covered up and tucked away for the Winter, our thoughts wander away from the business of the Holidays and run toward the upcoming Summer.

In the current edition of the Corvette Museum's "America's Sports Car among the interesting stories and articles there's something that has intrigued me for eons. It's the "History of zero to sixty".

The story is several pages in length; thus, we can only whet your appetite with some tasty tidbits.

The idea was conceived in 1947 by Tom McCahill while he was reporting on the latest new car(s) he made a reference how fast a car reached sixty miles per hour from a standing as it "0 to 60" time. It became a benchmark in just about every automotive road test report and was frequently used in automotive advertising.

"Road and Track" started publication in 1947 and by March of 1951 their road tests of foreign and domestic vehicles included the "acceleration time from zero to an honest 60 mph. The first car they tested was a Millman Minx with a "0 to 60" time of........40 seconds.

Today, we still talk in "seconds" but now we talk of single digits with a decimal point.

Our point of is to entice you and pique your interest in becoming a member of the National Corvette Museum, in addition to the quarterly "America's Sports Car" magazine there are many more interesting benefits by being a member of the NCM.

Who is the "Father" of the Corvette? ZORA Arkus-Duntov

Zachary "Zora" Arkus-Duntov (born Zachar Arkus; December 25, 1909 – April 21, 1996) was a Russian and American engineer whose work on the Chevrolet Corvette earned him the nickname "Father of the Corvette." Zora didn't create the Corvette, but he saved it. His vision fostered it into the car we know today. His focus was always on high performance and mid-engine design. Zora Duntov got hired by GM after seeing the Corvette prototype at the 1953 New York Motorama show, where he was impressed by its design but disappointed by its engine; he then wrote a letter to Chevrolet chief engineer Ed Cole expressing his desire to work on the car and outlining improvements he believed could be made, which so impressed Cole that he hired Duntov to join the Chevrolet engineering team.

He is sometimes erroneously referred to as the inventor of the Corvette; that title belongs to Harley Earl.

Harley Earl

Harley Earl **is** the Father of Corvette. The Corvette was his idea pure and simple. He was influenced after World War II watching Jaguars and MG's run road-racing courses like Watkins Glen. Harley Earl visited Watkins Glen, New York in 1951 to watch the Grand Prix of road racing. His experience at the race inspired him to design the Corvette, which went into production in 1953. He felt America needed its own sports car and he convinced GM to develop its own, inexpensive two-seater.

Originally code named "Project Opel", Earl kept the Corvette program pretty much to himself. He had a special small studio with a handful of people working on it. At the time, Earl wasn't sure which GM division ought to sell the Corvette, but he felt close to Ed Cole at Chevrolet and decided to give the "Bowtie Division" first shot. Cole was sold the first time he saw the prototype. He knew it was just what the stodgy Chevrolet division needed.

The Corvette debuted at Motorama in New York, January of 1953 and was an instant hit. Six months later the Corvette went into production and the rest is history. * information provided by National Corvette Museum and Ai.
